This information is exempt under Article 23 of the Freedom of Information (Jersey) Law 2011. See exemption details below.

FOI exemption applied:

Article 23 - Information accessible to applicant by other means

Information is absolutely exempt information if it is reasonably available to the applicant, otherwise than under this Law, whether or not free of charge.

Justification for exemption

All legislation is publicly available on the Jersey Legal Information Board site (for branchage law see "Loi (1914) sur la Voirie" in Chapter 25 Roads and Traffic).
