## Request

How many people have made an appeal or at the very least questioned why they have got a ticket whilst parked in the disabled bay on Halkett Place between the hours of $5: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. and 8 am, or anytime on a Sunday. I would like this information going back 10 years or since the sign with these hours was placed there.

## Response

The Parish does not hold information on how many people made an appeal or questioned the issue of the ticket whilst parked in the disabled bays on Halkett Place between the hours of 5:30 p.m. and 8 a.m., or anytime on a Sunday.

However, the Parish can confirm that since 2013, within those times, 321 tickets have been issued to vehicles unlawfully parked on all three disabled bays in Halkett Place.

## For information:

The Road Traffic (Disabled Persons) (Parking) (Jersey) Order 2002 prescribes the parts of Halkett Place, St Helier, which are reserved for use by disabled persons.
The Order specifies that a 4-hour limit applies between the hours of 8 am and 5.30 pm on a weekday (that is a day other than a Sunday), or for any period at any other time.

Since 2013 the areas reserved for use by disabled persons in Halkett Place are:

Halkett Place West side (between a point 37 yards north of Waterloo Street and a point 10 yards
north)
Until 3 April 2017 this area was - West side (between a point 2 yards south of the
northern boundary of No. }51\mathrm{ and a point }10\mathrm{ yards north)
West side (between a point one yard north of the southern boundary of the "Cock and Bottle" public house and Royal Court Road)
East side (between a point 15 yards north of Beresford Street and a point 15 yards further north)
Until 3 April 2017 this area was - East side (between a point 10 yards north of Beresford Street and a point 10 yards further north)
