The FOI section has various responses to the question "Honorary Police - Major Island Duties". Please could I have one for 2022.

Response

Members of the Honorary Police are elected to serve the Parish and undertake policing tasks within the Parish community; in 2022 this included assistance at the June 2022 elections for States members (Connétables and Deputies), attending the Visites du Branchage in their Parishes, Remembrance Day etc.

In certain circumstances officers will assist or operate outside the Parish to meet a policing need and this will include emergency situations. Considerable assistance was given with the two tragedies in December 2022 (loss of the fishing boat L'Ecume II and explosion at Haut du Mont, St Helier).

Policing assistance will also be given at island and parish events; in 2022 the major island events included:
