
Request

Dear resident at Maison Gallichan

I am writing to you again regarding the Village Improvement Scheme upon which the Parish and the Department of Infrastructure have been working together through public consultation for the past two years. Please see the attached chronology.

There is now a real opportunity to make our Village safer for children, the elderly and those with disability who want and need to move around it.

The public consultation has shown that this should be achieved by creating a sense of place through character enhancements that will communicate to the driver that they do not have priority and are a guest driving through a community area, as required by the Highway Code.

If you are of the opinion that the average traffic speed in the Village area particularly along Rue ès Picots is too fast and you want to see change, supporting the Village Improvement Scheme will achieve that.

I hope you will find time to attend the Exhibition at the Parish Hall tomorrow evening (Thursday 22nd June) any time between 5 and 7 PM to get a better understanding of how the Village is going to be enhanced. You should have already received a letter informing you about this which has gone to every household in the Parish.

In addition to the Trinity Village Improvement Scheme, Government is now consulting some parishes, including Trinity, about applying the principles of the approved Framework for Speed Limits throughout those parishes. This overlays and extends beyond the work about speed limits already done in the Village Improvement Scheme. Your support can be added to both by completing the attached questionnaire which can be returned to the Parish Hall Office by 29 July 2023. Alternatively, there is an online form at www.gov.je/consultations.
