Request

I understand that Grouville Roads Committee opposed speed reductions advocated by a working group put together by the head of Grouville School aimed at ensuring safer routes to school.

Please may I have copies of the agenda and supporting papers of the relevant meeting plus the minutes and any email correspondents relevant.

Response

The proposals of the Grouville Safer Routes to School Focus Group are set out in the notes of a meeting held on 28.9.21 – see below.

The agenda and minutes of the Roads Committee meeting on 1 November 2021, which reference 'Grouville School – Safer Routes to School', are exempt under Article 23.

There are no other minutes or correspondence concerning the Grouville Roads Committee opposing speed limit reductions advocated by a working group put together by the head of Grouville School aimed at ensuring safer routes to school.

FOI exemption applied:

Article 23 - Information accessible to applicant by other means

Information is absolutely exempt information if it is reasonably available to the applicant, otherwise than under this Law, whether or not free of charge. A scheduled public authority that refuses an application for information on this ground must make reasonable efforts to inform the applicant where the applicant may obtain the information.

Justification for exemption:

The minutes and agenda have been published in response to a previous FOI request – see <u>Freedom of Information Responses | Comité des Connétables (comite.je)</u> 'Roads Committee/Visites du Branchage' '04.04.2024 Grouville Roads Committee Minutes Agendas 2021-2024' items 9 and 10 of the minutes.

Article 25(2) - Personal Information - Personal data, applicant not subject but supply contravenes data protection principles

Information is absolutely exempt information if - (a) it constitutes personal data of which the applicant is not the data subject as defined in the Data Protection (Jersey) Law 2018; and (b) its supply to a member of the public would contravene any of the data protection principles, as defined in that Law.
