## Request

Following the imposition of an additional life sentence on ex-Met Police Officer David Carrick in November 2025, I request clarity on the measures the Honorary Police are implementing or have implemented to ensure that all serving officers meet appropriate suitability standards. Specifically, I would like a detailed breakdown of vetting status across the Honorary Police, including:

1. The total number of officers who have undergone and currently hold valid vetting;
2. The total number of officers whose vetting has been rescinded or cancelled; and
3. The total number of officers who do not presently hold valid vetting.

## Response

Members of the Honorary Police are elected to office and serve for a period of 3 years, they may stand for re-election to the same position or election to another position within the Honorary Police. Completion of a valid vetting process is a pre-requisite for all Honorary Police members before they are sworn into their roles by the Royal Court.
